Making Sugar Syrup for your Honey Bees

Use Honey-B-Healthy, 5-15ml per quart

4 lb. Bag of Sugar = 8 Cups
10 lb Bag of Sugar = 20 Cups

1/1 Ratio Most like Nectar for feeding larvae and drawing out honeycomb.
Used during Spring/Summer

1 Part Sugar with 1 Part Water

4 lb. bag of sugar (8C) / 8 cups of water Makes approximately 3 1/2 quart jars or 1 gallon.
10 lb. bag of sugar (20C) / 20 cups of water Makes approximately 8 3/4 quart jars or 2 1/2 gallons

11C / 11C

Makes 16 Cups or 8 Pints or 4 Quarts or 1 Gallon *(MTW verified)

5 1/2C / 5 1/2C

Makes 8 Cups or 4 Pints or 2 Quarts or 1/2 Gallon *(MTW verified)

2 3/4C / 2 3/4C

Makes 4 Cups or 2 Pints or 1 Quart or 1/4 Gallon *(MTW verified)

2/1 Ratio Most like Honey for consumption.
Used during Fall/Winter

2 Parts Sugar with 1 Part Water

4 lb bag of sugar (8C) / 4 Cups of water Makes approximately 2 Quarts or 1/2 Gallon ?
10 lb bag of sugar (20C) / 10 Cups of water Makes approximately 4 1/2 Quarts or 1 1/2 Gallons ?

Directions:

Bring water to a Boil.

TURN OFF HEAT.

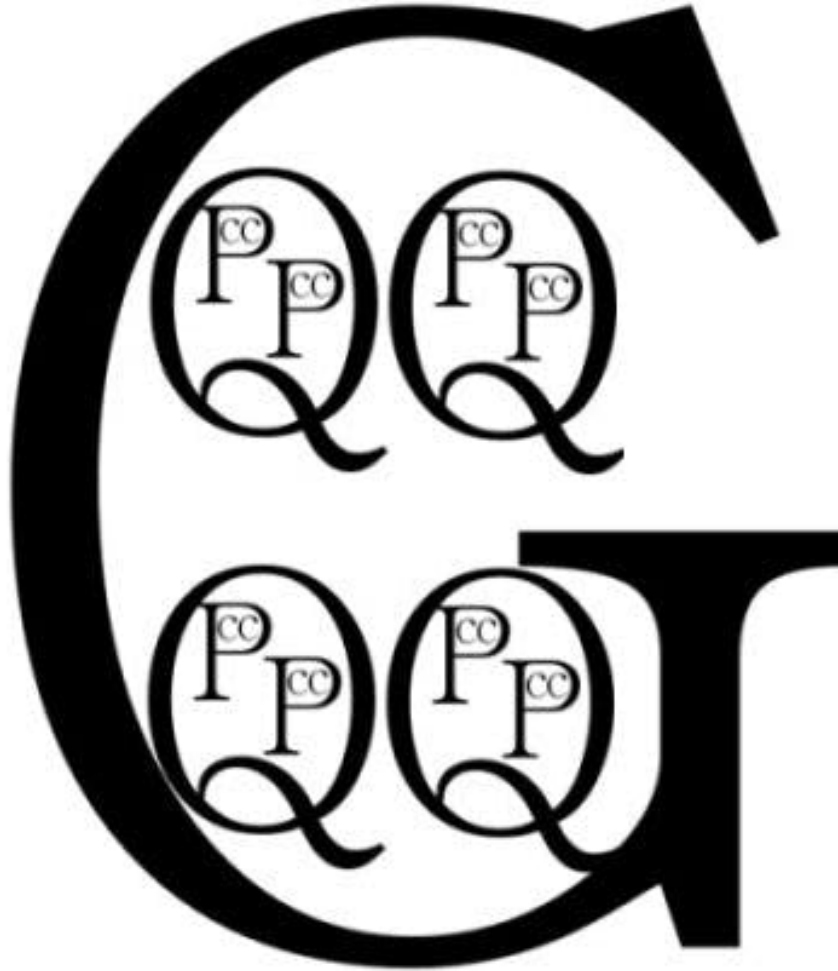
Remove from hot burner.

Slowly add sugar while constantly stirring with a stainless steel spoon.

Continue stirring until sugar has completely dissolved.

The sugar syrup will be clear but a little opaque (you cannot see sugar granules).

Let cool to room temperature before using.



16 Ounces in a **Cup** ----- 1C
2 **Cups** in a **Pint** ----- 2C
2 **Pints** in a **Quart** ----- 4C
2 **Quarts** in a $\frac{1}{2}$ **Gallon** -- 8C
4 **Quarts** in a **Gallon** ----- 16C

256----**Ounces** in a **Gallon**
16 ----- **Cups** in a **Gallon**
8----- **Pints** in a **Gallon**
4 ----- **Quarts** in a **Gallon**

MtwWallace Sugar Bricks Recipe

Ingredients:

- Cheap, disposable small cake, or cupcake tins from the store.
- 1 bucket
- 1 paint mixer attachment for a drill motor (optional, but very handy)
- 10 lb sugar
- 1 – 1 1/8 cup warm water
- 1 teaspoon Honey-B-Healthy

Mix the Honey-B-Healthy in the warm water.

- Pour the Sugar in the bucket.
- Slowly pour water into bucket all over the sugar.
- Use the paint mixer/drill motor to mix.
- Consistency should feel like sand or artificial snow texture.
- Pack into the disposable tins.
- Bake at 160° - 180° for 2 hours
- Leave out to cool overnight

Put spacer (1.500”) on top of brood upper BroodBox, place Sugar Brick on small paper towel on top of the frames of the BroodBox.
